CCKC January 2015 Meeting Minutes

On Wednesday, January 21, 2015, at 7:00 PM, the CCKC meeting held at Uncle Buck's/Bass Pro was called to order by **President Jim Cahill**. There were approximately 90 members and 7 guests in attendance.

Hendrick: Jim introduced Hendrick, CCKC's sponsor, and **Hendrick's representative John Bivens** who was in attendance. John reminded us the club's March meeting will be held at their facility and they will provide pizza.

Jim introduced CCKC's 2015 Executive Committee; Vice President-Gene Sinkler and who also handles the raffle and club attire; Treasurer-Jim Juliff the bean counter; Editor-Arnie Sdano who organizes and publishes the monthly Hi Beams; Secretary-Linda Downing who takes notes at all meetings; Membership Chairperson-Carol Schwartz who handles all club membership information; Activities Chairperson-Cynthia Sdano who facilitates club activities; and Insurance Coordinator-Barb Kearns who will handle insurance and extra duties as necessary.

Jim also introduced the appointed officers: National Corvette Museum (NCM) Ambassador-Adam Hoehn and Webmaster-Steve Shinners, not in attendance. Jim announced the CCKC web page has recently been updated and includes an Activities calendar as well as a page on which members can sell a corvette or corvette parts. He encouraged all to view the web page.

Jim advised the Executive Committee met in early January; he will email members the EC meeting minutes, but shared some of the highlights of said meeting which included discussion of car shows-the Hendrick show will be June 7, 2015 and the Zona Rosa show will be held on September 26, 2015; judging forms-they should be consistent for each

show; waiver forms-only needed for an event outside of the club meeting; and charities.

Gene Sinkler discussed the monthly raffle. He noted there was desire to move toward something new and is starting a cash pot and a dining card from Uncle Buck's. Member donations of items are still welcome for the monthly raffle. All raffle money goes towards CCKC's charity.

Membership: Carol Schwartz introduced CCKC guests: Denise German, she has a 2006 Yellow Coupe and a 1967 Red Coupe and Larry Eichman, a former member who has a 1978 pace car. Carol introduced new members: Tim & Carol Carlin-they have a 2015 red convertible; Howard and Judy Furr, they have a 2007 black coupe; and Clifford Scott who was not in attendance.

CCKC membership is currently at 159. There were 154 renewals out of 186 members from 2014, an 83% retention rate. Non-renewals comprised members who sold their cars, spouse wasn't renewed, or they moved.

Carol reminded members the Membership Directory was recently emailed to all by Arnie Sdano; if there is any change in your information please email Carol by January 28 as she will be emailing the revised directory at the end of the month. She clarified the directory has "GF" after some member names; this is for her information but indicates that member was grandfathered as that person was a member of CCKC prior to insurance. Carol thanked Arnie for emailing the directory to the members on her behalf.

Secretary: Linda Downing sought and obtained approval of the November 2014 meeting minutes as published in the Hi-Beams.

National Corvette Museum (NCM): Ambassador Adam Hoehn reported the Motorsports Park race track was voted "outstanding facility" of the year by the Race Track Business Conference; last year's winner was the Indy Speedway. Flushing toilets are coming soon to the race track. The park had record attendance of 251,258 in 2014 due to the sinkhole; this was the highest attendance since 1999 when attendance was 200,900. Adam reminded us that Amazon Smile will donate 0.5% of the price of your eligible AmazonSmile purchases to a charitable donation of your choice; NCM is a charitable organization.

Treasurer: Jim Juliff discussed the income and expenses for CCKC for 2014. Jim Clyde pointed out the Holiday Party expense, noting he attended but wanting to make all aware of the expense. Chuck Abbott commented it was one of the best Holiday Parties he could remember and thanked those who planned the event. Jim reviewed the 2015 CCKC budget, including the projected fundraising income and expenses and the projected donation for the CCKC 2015 charity. There was discussion of the current bank balance and some spend down of that amount but keeping a balance as a safety net for a bad year of fundraising should there be a rain out for one of the car shows. The CCKC 2015 budget was approved.

2015 Charity: The club voted on the number of charities the club wished to support for 2015; there was a majority vote by the members to support one charity for 2015. In the member vote to ascertain the number of charities CCKC desired to support for 2015 there were zero votes for 3 or 4 charities, and 17 members voted to support two charities for 2015. Although representatives of the charities were in attendance for the meeting, they were excused during the club voting process.

Presentation of Charities:

There were 4 charity nominations for CCKC's consideration for 2015; CCKC member Brad Korris discussed



COMMUNITY LINC an organization on which he serves as a Board member. He also introduced a representative of agency who provided additional details.

CCKC member Julie Dailey discussed **KCReGAP** (Retired Greyhounds as Pets) and introduced a representative of the organization who provided details of their mission and work.

CCKC member Rick Eisberg introduced members of **Circle of Hope NICU Foundation** who spoke on the mission and goals of the foundation. Rick advised his son was a preemie and he wished an organization such as Circle of Hope would have been in existence at that time as it would have made the situation less stressful for him and his family.

CCKC member Roland Norris discussed **St. Michael's Center**, declaring his dedication to veterans. He introduced Art Fillmore (a founder of Heart of America Stand Down/CCKC's charity for 2013) who spoke about the Center.

CCKC 2015 Charity: St. Michael's Center. (After the charity presentations, representatives of the charities were excused and a written vote was taken of the members; the popular vote went to St. Michael's Center).

Activities Chairperson: Cynthia Sdano thanked those members who attended the Activities Planning gathering at their home.

On a crisp day in late December, one of the ultimate summer-type cars, the Corvette, is in hot demand at Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission at 8300 W. Shawnee Mission Parkway in Merriam.

The new 2015 Corvette Z06 has created the buzz at the dealership that is becoming known nationally as one of the top places to buy a Corvette.

"This one has 650 horsepower as opposed to the 460 horsepower it normally has," said Mike McGinley, president and general manager at Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission.



"This is the most powerful car and the highest horsepower car that General Motors has ever come out with. It can go from zero to 60 in 2.9 seconds."

And this is coming on the heels of the resurrection of last year's Corvette Stingray, which was completely redesigned for 2014. Before then, it had not been called the Stingray since 1976.

Because of the dealership's growing national reputation for selling Corvettes, McGinley and Robert Wiegers, performance car manager at Hendrick Chevrolet, are fielding calls from interested buyers across the country as well as from those in Kansas City.

Just before Christmas, Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission loaded a Corvette Z06 on a truck and delivered it to Jacksonville, Fla.

McGinley said they had deals going with highperformance car buyers in St. Louis, Florida, Texas and even as far away as Hawaii.

December was a very good month for Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission for selling Corvettes. In fact, they sold nearly 40 Corvettes in December, which was its second best month of the year.

"For years you can only earn as many as you sell. So how are you going to earn more? We only get 30 a year, how are we going to sell 200? Well,



we were buying them, paying people window sticker and then selling them to try to build up our business over time." McGinley and Wiegers said the dealership's passion for Corvettes was one way to connect with the community in another way than just selling cars.

> The dealership sponsors two Corvette Clubs in Kansas City and through them, it has helped out with homeless veterans and Camp Quality.

> "Once a year we go up and give the kids a ride around the camp in a Corvette and spend the afternoon with them," Wiegers said.

> Owning a Corvette, Wiegers said, is a lifestyle. "The grandfather had one, the father had one and now the son wants one," Wiegers said. "I have been here long enough to see the generational move from father to son. It is a family event. "The overwhelming response is, 'I can't believe I have this car.' They ordered this car 18 months out and then they get into the car and the feel of it and the opportunity to drive it, and being one of the few in Kansas City to have one is exciting. This is their prize possession to take on the Plaza on Sunday. It is their pride and joy."

"We are the 10th largest Corvette dealer in the country," McGinley said. "Most dealers may have one or maybe they don't have any. "We are lucky to have a few because we have a pretty deep order bank." They currently have about 35 Corvettes at the dealership.

It is no accident that Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission has created a Corvette niche. McGinley said it starts with the owner Rick Hendrick and his obvious passion for high performance vehicles.

"1993 is when Rick bought the stores in Kansas City," McGinley said. "Rick has always been a car enthusiast since he was a young guy. He was a mechanic. He dragged race. His first car was a Corvette. That is the car he always aspired to."

McGinley has the same type of passion for Corvettes and is a reason why Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission sells so many Corvettes. McGinley came to the dealership in 1992, became general manager in 1998 and a partner in 2000. In addition, McGinley races his Corvette in the Sports Car Club of America's T1 road racing class.

"The push came when I became the general manager because they are really cool cars," McGinley said. It meant taking a chance. "Not every Chevy dealer is a Corvette dealer," McGinley said. "You have to earn the right to be a Corvette dealer by selling them.

McGinley said a few people put in orders for the new Corvette Z06 as early as late 2013. Now that it has arrived, McGinley said it lives up to expectations. "If you pick up Motor Trend and read the articles in Motor Trend about the new Z06, it will tell you it is the best car on the market, period," McGinley said. "The press the car is getting is bringing in a lot of people.

"We are getting people who drive high performance Mercedes. We are getting people who are driving Porsche Turbos. We are getting a lot of new type of customers that in the past wouldn't necessarily consider them."

The cost for the Z06 ranges from \$80,000 to \$90,000. When customers come into Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission to buy SUVs or a family car, they can't help but let their eyes wander to all the Corvettes. Plenty of customers take photos of the Z06. "We give them free access to the car," Wiegers said. "It starts that build of enthusiasm."

The goal for Hendrick Chevrolet Shawnee Mission is to sell 250 Corvettes in 2015. "That is quite a few," McGinley admits. But they are going for it.
