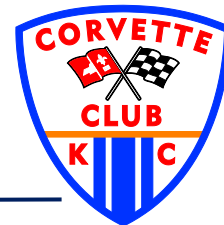
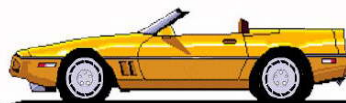

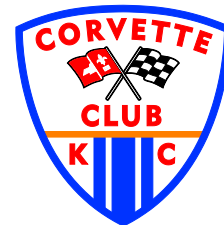
Hendrick Car Show – Correction!

July 7-Johnny's cruise –Gene Sinkler Coordinator. We had 40 people show up at Johnny's to dine on their Taco specials.

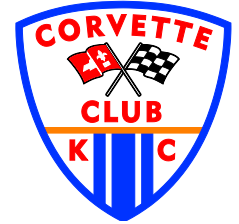

A group of about eight CCKC ladies enjoyed crepes and other French menu items at Chez Elle. The food was as delightful as the companionship that we shared.

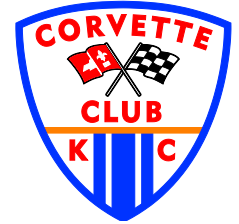
July 21st T-Bones Game - Todd Ford

On Wednesday July 15, 2015 at 7:00 PM, the CCKC meeting held at Uncle Buck's/Bass Pro was called to order by **President Jim Cahill**.

There was no representative from Hendrick in attendance.

Membership: Vicki Sinkler welcomed new members who have joined recently; she introduced those new members in attendance. Cynthia Sdano reminded them to see her so she could get their picture for publication in the Hi Beams .

Secretary: Linda Downing advised there was a change in the June meeting minutes. It related to information on the July 11 Outlaw Cigar event. She advised of the revision and the revised June 2015 meeting minutes were approved. Treasurer: Jim Juliff advised we are ahead of budget for the year but behind for the month.

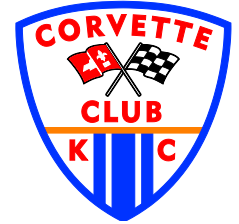

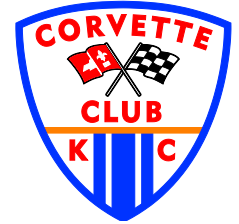

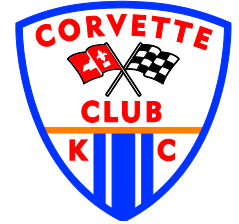

Jim Cahill noted there had been comments about the EC minutes and advised if anyone wants to hear the past EC meeting minutes they could be read. John Southerland inquired about a change in the By-Law as the minutes have not been read. There was discussion and a motion made and passed that the EC meeting minutes be emailed to all members. Chuck Abbott stated he did not believe this was a suitable manner in which to disburse the minutes advising people would leave them on the tables, etc. Chuck advised he was opposed to the EC minutes being emailed and stated the EC had an obligation to advise club members of their meetings and said minutes should be read. Janice Burkhead reminded members that the EC met every quarter,

not every month. Clarence Hill stated members should vote at each club meeting following an EC meeting as to whether the minutes be read. 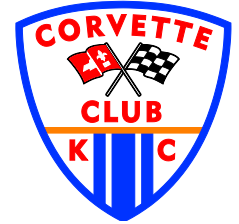

THEFT OF YOUR CORVETTE

**Prepared for Hi-Beams By Chuck
Levenson & Joe Campbell**

In the last 30 years 55,132 corvettes have been stolen. The loss of your corvette to theft is something that all of us should consider. It is estimated that 724,672 cars were stolen in 2012, which is a decline from the high of 1,661,738 in 1991. The ratio of corvettes stolen to late model cars is low, but if it is your corvette it is still significant. Recently thieves have found that an inexpensive electronic device can be used to fool your car into thinking it is your key fob. An accountant on my staff was in a staff meeting when the Kansas City Kansas police called to inform him that they had recovered his stolen corvette. The problem was that he didn't know that his Vette was gone. The corvette was taken from a large employee parking lot early in the afternoon and used in a robbery.

Auto theft increases approximately 10% during the New Year and Halloween holidays and 5% to 10% from June through September. Note for some reason auto theft declines significantly during the Christmas holidays. Information on thefts by state show that California has the highest rate of auto theft with Missouri ranking 10th and Kansas not in the top 10. Annual theft statistics by production year of corvette are not available, but for the C-5 and C-4 models their earlier production years were more popular targets.



The requirement by NHTSA for standardization of Vin numbers starting with the 1981 model year and alarms installed by the manufacturer have helped to reduce auto theft for newer models of corvettes; however I still recommend we take certain precautions to reduce our risk of becoming a statistic. **Hagerty** Insurance Company and National Insurance Crime Bureau have some suggestions to reduce the risk of theft to all corvette owners:

Level One-If your corvette is stored lock your garage, keep blinds & shades closed, cover your car and don't leave your keys in the ignition. If you are driving your corvette remove the keys from the ignition, lock your doors and close your windows and park in well-lit areas.

Level Two-alarms, window stickers and marking parts with ID numbers. Also On Star has been available in corvettes since 2005 and I feel their value for recovery from theft during the first few hours is worth considering. On Star can locate your stolen corvette and newer models can prevent it from being restarted by a thief or slow down a stolen corvette that refuses to stop for law enforcement.

Level Three-Steering wheel locks, brake pedal locks, wheel locks, remove ignition rotor, distributor cap, fuel pump fuse, kill switches and disconnect battery cable.

Level Four- a tracking device such as the **LoJack** system in a hidden location in your corvette.

Be careful about modifying classic corvettes if you intend to show them as some of these changes may affect the originality of your corvette.

If your corvette is stolen your chances of recovery are best if it can be located within the first few hours. You should carry with you your license plate number, Vin or chassis number, engine number and the telephone number for **On Star**. And last ,but not least, if your corvette is a show car and over 10 years old, consider using collector car insurance to avoid disputes over valuation in case it is stolen. Most large insurance companies offer collector car coverage; however I am aware that **Hagerty** also has a service that locates hard to find parts for your classic if it is damaged.

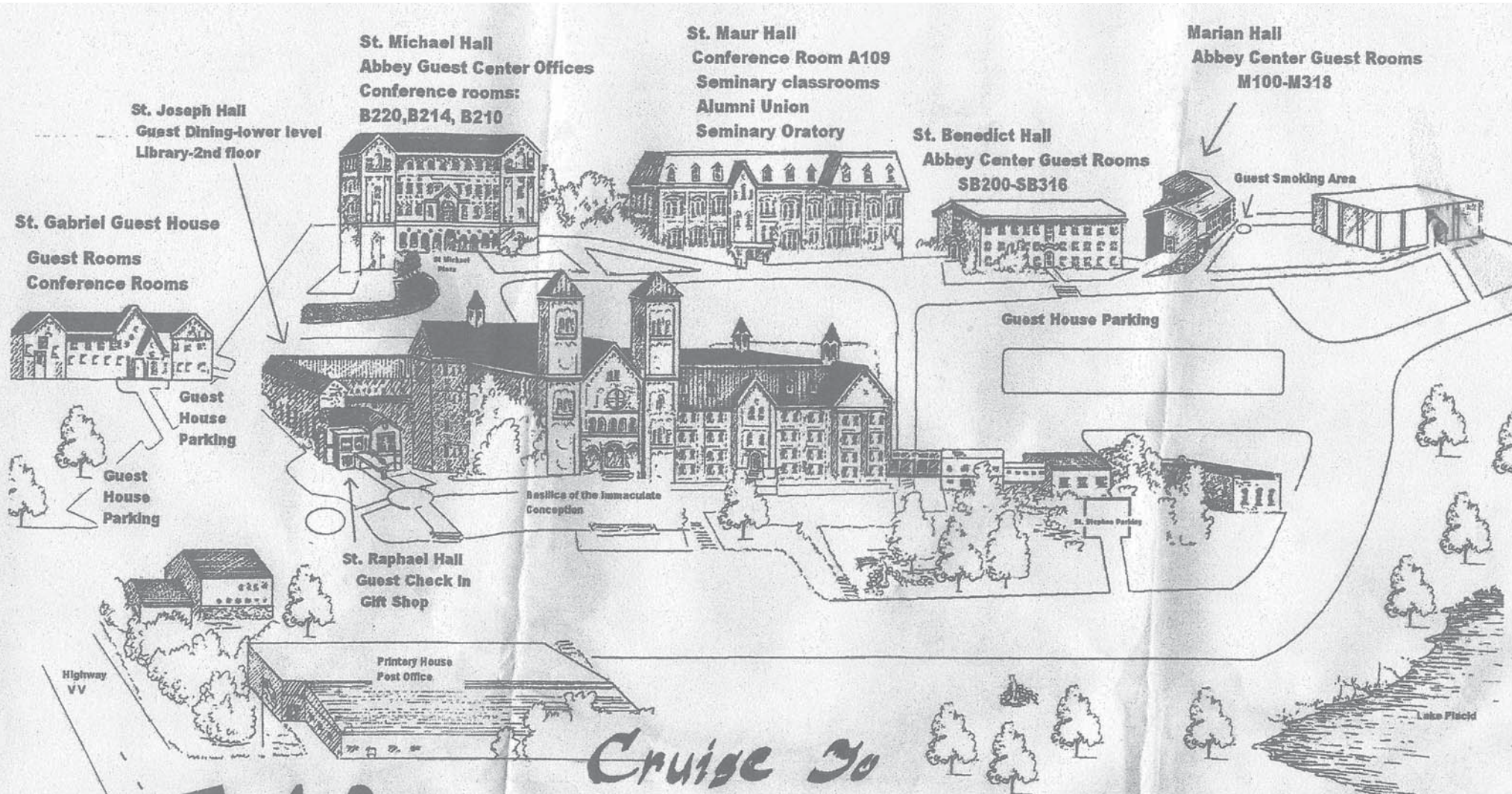
