

Corvette Club of Kansas City Bereavement Policy

In addition, if the member has been associated with CCKC for more than one year, a donation will be made to the specified memorial. If no memorial is specified, a contribution to the NCM in their name will be made. This will be done for any primary member or spouse. The EC committee has flexibility in determining the value of each \$50 is an acceptable level. The contribution. Membership Chairperson will be responsible for sending cards and obtaining the proper information pertaining to the specific memorials. EM members will act accordingly".

A motion was made and seconded to approve the bereavement policy.

Jim Cahill announced we should begin to think about officer voting in November as it gives those who have not served in an officer position to give it some consideration. We are a

growing club with a strong nucleus that needs to keep going. We need new ideas and new officers. Vicki Sinkler said she would like to see this occur in September and October so by the November meeting we have the names on the ballots. She reminded us of what the By-Laws stated: The Club By-Laws state "The Officers shall be elected by the membership attending the November meeting...The officers shall be nominated from the floor during the October and November meetings..." Vicki suggested we change the By-Laws to incorporate nominations in September. Janice Burkhead stated in the past year nominating was extended to October and it didn't seem to make a difference we were still nominating people at the November meeting so while a good idea in the past it seemed it didn't make a difference. Chuck Abbott suggested each officer prepare a short summary of their duties and the time it takes to perform said duties as well as if they will run for their position for the 2016 year and present this to club members at the September meeting. This would allow new members to consider an officer position and express interest by the October meeting. Fred Bybee reminded us the current practice for election of Officers is better than it was in the past; if you were absent you were nominated. Joe Campbell supported the idea and thought it would help to avoid a crisis in November. Joe Campbell also suggested that we currently plan some events for January to assist the incoming Activities Chairperson so we can maintain an active club calendar active.


