CCKC October 2015 Meeting Minutes

On Wednesday, October 21, 2015 at 7:00 PM, the CCKC meeting held at Uncle Buck's/Bass Pro was called to order by **President Jim Cahill.** There were approximately 80 people in attendance.

Jim advised he has Judging sheets from the Zona Rosa show for those who wanted to see how they fared with their Show & Shine efforts.

Hendrick: Jim Cahill introduced Joe Phillips our new Hendrick representative. Joe is the head of Corvettes at Hendrick. Joe is at Hendrick every day but Tuesday. Joe announced Hendrick has "special pricing" for CCKC members for any vehicle except for the Z06. Hendrick also has "special pricing" for CCKC members for service and "special pricing" for CCKC members on parts. suggested you advise Hendrick that you are a CCKC member in advance of your service, parts purchase, etc., rather than when you are when you checking out as it makes their paperwork easier and avoids any delay. Joe advised the Service and Parts departments utilize different software than the Sales department; even if your Sales team notes in your profile that you are a CCKC member, your profile does not carry over to the Service or Parts department thus you must advise Service and Parts of your CCKC membership, in advance, to get "special pricing".

Joe announced Hendrick's referral program; if you refer someone to Hendrick and that party purchases a vehicle, Hendrick will pay the referring party \$100 and pay CCKC \$100. Hendrick must be advised of your referral up front, not at the close of the purchase.



Raffle: Gene Sinkler explained the raffle

items; \$25 Target gift cards (2), battery charger, Uncle Buck's card, wine, Corvette car throw, Corvette 50th anniversary coin, Kansas City Repertory tickets (2), \$25 cash, and a Z06 C7 brochure. We raised \$162 from the raffle, after the \$25 cash won by Joe Campbell was returned to the club's charity at Joe's request. Items were donated by: Hendrick Chevrolet, Chuck Levenson, Fritz Mosher, Chuck Abbott, and Patti Norris.

Gene has C7 items left over from the Zona Rosa show which are being held for the November raffle.

Membership: Vicki Sinkler introduced new members who joined at the Zona Rosa show: Carrol & Claudia Scott, and Shelleen & Bryce Delaney.

Guests Sean & Denise Humphrey were in attendance, one of our CCKC members talked to them at Sonic and suggested they come to our meeting and check out our club.

Vicki also recognized several members who have been away and are back and some of our newer members who were in attendance.

Renewals: Vicki reminded us CCKC membership renewals for 2016 must be paid by the November club meeting in order for members to have the opportunity to vote in the November election of Officers. You may bring your renewal membership form and payment to the November meeting or

Secretary: Linda Downing obtained approval of the September 2015 meeting minutes as published in the Hi Beams.

Treasurer: Jim Juliff reported that we are ahead of budget for the month and for the year. Jim reported the Zona Rosa show had 93 registered cars; 42 members, 51 nonmembers. He reported on the Net Income from the Zona Rosa show's registration and fundraising activities. Jim reported this year's fundraising income from the Zona Rosa show was the highest in the last 3 years. The Route 66 quilt raffle resulted in additional fundraising income; the quilt was donated by Arnie & Cynthia Sdano.

Jim reported on the combined net registration and fundraising income from the Hendrick and Zona Rosa shows. Year to date, with the fundraising from the two car shows and other fundraising activities, we have already exceeded our fundraising goal for the year. Jim Cahill asked those members who worked both car shows to support the club charity by having them stand for recognition.

Club Insurance: Jim Cahill announced the majority of members did not see the need to continue the club umbrella coverage and it was being dropped or cancelled for 2016. Renewal membership for 2016 dropped \$10 from last year; 2016 renewal membership is \$45 for primary and \$10 for spouse; the 2015 renewal was \$55 for primary and \$10 spouse. There were questions about where the additional money went; the difference in the savings from dropping the

insurance versus the \$10 drop in renewal. **Barb Kearns** advised last year we under budgeted insurance and spouses were not charged for insurance.



The current policy and 2016 policy provides coverage for all spouses.

National Corvette Museum (NCM): Adam Hoehn reported Wendell Strode, Executive Director for NCM was awarded the Kentucky Nonprofit leadership award. Next month's club raffle will include 4-tickets to the NCM. Adam reminded us that AmazonSmile will donate 0.5% of the price of your eligible AmazonSmile purchases to a charity of your choice; NCM is a charitable organization.

Activities: Cynthia Sdano thanked all who hosted and coordinated our September events;

Joe showed us the trophies which were crystal, Chuck Levenson won Best of Class for C6's and Joe Campbell won 2nd for the C4 class. CCKC had 9 cars and 14 people attend the show. Joe announced there were technical difficulties with car photographs and if you wanted one see Joe.
- 9/26/15 Zona Rosa show **Kathy Denning** coordinated, this was a marvelous show.
- 10/5/15 Granite City Dinner Cruise- Jamie Chaney
- 10/10/15 Fall Color Run **Chuck Levenson**. We had a lot of fun but not a lot of color.

New Business:

Roland Norris pointed out that the club had not voted or been asked to vote on the club's fundraising for Breast Cancer Awareness which was associated with the Fall Color Run and this month's club meeting. He pointed out CCKC voted in January to support St. Michael's Veterans Center as the club charity for 2015. There was discussion that KCCA voted on whether their club would support the Breast Cancer Awareness project when Hendrick contacted KCCA. Tech Talk by:

Chuck Levenson & Joe Campbell

Winter Storage Prep:

- Wash (wax if water does not bead-up)
- 2. Change the oil, even though you did not drive many miles. Used oil contains acids that are not friendly to metal. ALWAYS change the oil once a year.
- 3. Vacuum and clean the interior of your car. This discourages vermin from living in the Corvette over the winter. Do not use moth balls!!!
- 4. Use a fuel additive, such as Sta-bill and fill the gas tank full. Avoid gas with ethanol by using BP 93 octane.
- 5. Take care of the battery. C5's and C6's should be trickle charged once every 3 weeks. Or use a good quality battery tender to continuously keep it fully charged.
- 6. Store the Corvette in a safe place. Rodent traps should be placed in the garage to guard against field mice that like to come in for the winter. These creatures do bad things to wiring.
- 7. Roll up the windows and close the doors.
- 8. Put a cover over your Corvette. A multi-layered cover that is water repellent is good. Make sure it has a soft side against the paint.
- 9. Start your Corvette one a month to keep things lubricated. Let the engine run sufficient time to warm-up

to operating temperature and get the water out of the exhaust. Normally, about 15 minutes is sufficient. If you do not intend to start your Corvette periodically during the winter months and it has a carburetor, use a fogging spray down the carburetor to protect it during the winter months.

10. Check the air in the tires at least once during the winter. Move the car so the tires do not get flat spots.

C6 Corvette Owners File Class Action Suit Over LS7 Engine – By Chris Demorro

The aftermath of valve guide wear found in the Z06. That's according to The Truth About Cars, which reports that 19 owners have filed over 70 claims against GM, accusing the automaker of negligence, fraud, and even violations of the R.I.C.O. act that was established to bring down organized crime.

The issue at hand stems from accusations of excessive valve guide play, specifically on-concentric valve guide and valve seat centerlines that lead to premature wear, and eventually, early engine failure. A common check for valve guide wear is the so-called "wiggle test" that the lawsuit says GM initially used, but then discarded after determining that this method of testing would lead to costly repairs and investigations. This issue can ruin cylinder heads or absolutely grenade an engine, and it

is commonly accepted as a real thing within the Corvette community.

Most owners seem resigned to deal with it on their own, and GM has reportedly acknowledged the issue internally, but publicly remains tight-lipped. However, this class action lawsuit could force GM to offer repairs or restitution to any owners who suffered from valve guide wear, and it would be yet another blow to the automaker's reputation after the trying ignition switch scandal.




