#### **May Events:**

### **Corvettes Cruise to Squirrel Cage, Penney's and Ninja Moose**

On a chilly but sunny May 14, Lee and Janice Burkhead led a group of 29 people and 17 cars for CCKC's first open-road Corvette cruise of the season. The Corvetters hit the road from the Argosy Casino in Riverside, and traveled north to their first stop: the Squirrel Cage Jail in Gallatin, Missouri. The jail is one of only three remaining rotary jails in the country. Our tour guide, Trudi Burton, led us through the unheated and uncooled men's and women's quarters of the jail, noting that temperatures ranged from well below zero in the winter to 120 degrees in the summer inside the jail. Most members agreed that seeing the harsh conditions in which prisoners lived should be a good deterrent to a life of crime.







Following the jail tour, the Corvette group moved on to the J.C. Penney Museum in Hamilton, Missouri. Caretakers Barry and Kathy Mathia kept the museum open later than usual for our group, providing information about Mr. Penney and the museum. Barry and Kathy also brought their own Corvette to join us for part of the cruise.





After enjoying the museum, a number of club members visited several of the many quilt shops on Hamilton's Main Street, and eventually the entire CCKC group found their way to our next tour stop, the Ninja Moose Brewery. Ninja Moose owner Scott Folke graciously welcomed CCKC members and guests to try his selection of microbrews. While at the brewery, club members dined on delicious Hank and Tank's BBQ, which was catered in by Hank and Tank's owner, Lowell Henry.

When we left the Ninja Moose, Barry and Kathy led our caravan to see J.C. Penney's personal 1947 Cadillac, which is owned by Kathy's father, Dean Hales, in Hamilton. Dean purchased the car from Penney 50 years ago, and says he often has visitors come by to see it. Dean says he still drives the vehicle.

On leaving Hamilton, some members opted to take the quick highway route back to Kansas City, while others chose to join the caravan through some winding and hilly back-roads – a slower journey, but much more scenic.

#### **May Minutes:**

#### **Discovery Survey Summary:**

We created the 2016 Discovery Survey for many reasons - primarily to ensure our ladder was against the right wall.....that we were progressing and not digressing. Survey invitations were sent to all active members of record. We received a response rate of approximately 60%. Names of survey respondents will remain anonymous.

After reviewing the survey results, there are 5 important areas that need improvement based on **membership feedback**:

#### **#1.** Leadership Issues

- a.) Successful clubs have positive, passionate, strong leaders who need to be willing to:
  - Answer all member questions and concerns
  - Listen to new ideas and be prepared to act on them
  - Be open to others getting involved in problem solving
  - Share knowledge
  - Gather input from members on a regular basis
- b.) CCKC Leaders must have a comprehensive understanding of Roberts Rules of order and how they are applied. Members need to be confident that at each CCKC meeting, EC Leaders will ensure that:

- Discussions will be conducted according to the rules
- Members will be treated with dignity and respect at all times
- c.) Confidential Source

The CCKC Leadership needs to make sure that any member who requires a confidential meeting to discuss sensitive issues can do so. We need to make absolutely sure that we take member concerns seriously and that we will work hard to find solutions, including:

- Identifying individuals who are currently dissatisfied within the club.
- Creating a process for disgruntled members to discuss concerns and areas of dissatisfaction
- Meeting on member terms and follow through with possible additional recommendations and solutions

#### #2. Members want more FUN!

People typically join a club because they think it can add value to their lives, either for personal reasons or business career. They will continue to be members as long as:

- The perceived value is there
- That club leaders are positive,

 That people are willing to share knowledge, answer questions and listen to new ideas.



Corvette owners are united by the car. CCKC and our Club Members, both men and women, need to work together and get involved in recommending and volunteering to plan:

- Social events
- Destinations trips
- Road rallies
- Flash cruises
- Spending time with each other in a learning environment

#### **#4.** Volunteer Coordinator

A "Volunteer Coordinator" position needs to be established to train a pool of volunteers for internal Club events, monthly meetings, car shows, flash cruises, and any other sanctioned CCKC events. This would allow everyone to be mentored by a single source, become part of a strategic team and be able choose the type of projects each individual would enjoy. Particularly those projects that would be sensitive to the time volunteers have to spare.

The Volunteer Coordinator could also recruit and train "in house" CCKC representatives (from men & women members) who would ensure that every member feels welcome and an integral part of the Club during all CCKC monthly meetings, car shows, events, etc.

#### **#5.** Membership Retention & Loyalty

- Stay focused on controlled growth.
- Add 10 to 15 new members per guarter

- Attend car shows for new member possibilities
- Follow up on all membership correspondence
- Reward and recognize member achievements
- Initiate the Spotlight Program. Select members from our own club to discuss areas of Corvette expertise and have then discuss their own experiences.



#### <u>Tech Talk/News - Chuck Levenson:</u>

Emergency hood release cables can be purchased for C3, C4 and C5 Generation corvettes and are an economical modification if ever needed. You can easily fashion cables for C3's/C4's yourself using braided wire and chinch type ferrules or loop clamps to form the loop and a cable stop at the latch ends that can either be a cinch fit or screw type. Stainless steel wire is recommended to avoid issues with oxidation.

When your car is ready to be judged, place the "Ready to be Judged" sheet on the dash and open the driver's and passenger's windows. Put **COMPLETED** judging sheet on driver's seat.

Hood <u>MUST</u> be open or 25 points will be deducted Hatch/Trunk (where applicable) <u>MUST</u> be open or 2 points will be deducted Judges will open driver's side door if not already open/ajar.

The following is how your car will be judged:

#### **Exterior:**

Cleanliness (dirt, dust, bugs, tar, wax residue) Windshield, mirrors and back glass (free of smudges). Exhaust Tips. No deduction for paint chips or chips in windshield.

#### Wheels & Tires:

Cleanliness of wheels (free of dust, dirt, smudges, road tar).

Cleanliness of tires (reasonably clean, free of blemishes, free of stones).

Cleanliness of wheel wells (free of dirt, sand, gravel).

#### Interior:


