Harry is a founding member of the Kansas City branch of NCRS, which represents Corvettes from the year 1999 and older. Although there are six Corvette clubs in the metro, none were specifically for old cars, so that is why they applied to NCRS to join.



Knowledge is power concerning a Corvette. You don't have to own a car to be a member of NCRS. As long as you own

the car, NCRS doesn't care what you do to it. NCRS judging strongly influences the value of a car. A Top Flight Car will be more valuable.

Tony Stein is on the judging team for NCRS as well as Bloomington Gold. Members of NCRS are global and are fascinated by what Corvettes looked like when new. In judging, you are not competing against others. Your car is being judged on its own. Everyone can come, be judged and receive a blue ribbon.

The NCRS Judging Guides are not just for judging. They are informational in helping to restore a car. NCRS also works as a network to help people find car parts. It, plus many other books, are available at www.ncrs.org.

The Top Flight Award is for a car that is restored to as original as possible. A Sportsman Car is not judged. An NCRS judging takes about four hours; the car is judged by five teams of two judges each. The cost for judging runs \$60 to \$75.



Tech Talk/News - Jeff Moss:

C5 and newer Corvettes are equipped with two fuel tanks, one on each side of the vehicle. This arrangement allows for a reasonable fuel capacity without limiting storage space in the vehicle. During operation fuel is delivered to the engine by an electric pump located in the driver's side tank. Some fuel flow from the electric pump is diverted to the right hand tank to operate a syphon that is used to move fuel from the passenger side tank to the driver's side tank.



There are fuel level sensors in each tank and if there is a discrepancy between the feedback provided by each sensor a DTC (Diagnostic Trouble Code) will be logged and the fuel level gauge will show as empty. This design makes sulfur deposits on the fuel sending units that would lead to slight variations in fuel level readings on other vehicles much more problematic on these cars, especially C5's and C6's. To prevent problems be sure to use quality fuels and apply a fuel system treatment that contains PEA (polyetheramine)

once or twice a year. Techron from Chevron is the additive most often mentioned and it works well but cleaners from STP, Gumout and Valvoline also sell fuel system cleaners containing PEA. To ensure the fuel treatment is distributed to both tanks add the treatment when the system is almost empty. As the driver's side tank is filled, fuel and the treatment you added before fueling, will flow from the driver's side tank into the passenger side tank.



The Track Event - A Group for every driver...

Group A - Top speed of 60 mph.

This is the gentlemen's group. There will be spirited driving if you like, but at a slower, more relaxed pace. Drive here if speed isn't your thing, if you don't have experience on a track, if you don't want to be pressured by cars behind you, if your car cannot go faster than 60 miles per hour, or, if your passenger is going to be shrieking in your ear that you are going too fast!

Group B - Top speed of 80 mph.

Drive here if you want spirited driving with some cars at the limit of their performance, at 80 miles per hour on the straights. Also consider this group if you have a powerful car but limited track experience. If your car is a classic with an engine with a displacement of 1,500 cubic centimeters or less this may be your group. Remember, as with all groups, there are more corners than straights.

Group C - Top speed of 100 mph.

This group is for cars that can easily get up to 100 miles per hour, have good handling and brakes, and have drivers that want to test their skills. Cars in this group will be powerful classic sports cars whose drivers have track experience. Some V6 engines may be at home here as well as V8's that will run conservatively. You will be pushed by cars behind you, and you will be passed by some.

Group V - Vintage Race Cars.

This group will feature vintage race cars from the past. Cars in this group will be the old, fast sports cars. Speed will not be the focus of this group. It will be a chance to celebrate some of the fantastic cars of the track's history and time period. The cars will be hand picked by our organization.

Group H - Historical Sports Cars.

A very unique group of factory stock cars produced prior to 1960. These are slow sports cars. This group is by invitation only, but if you think you have a car that would represent well, please contact us.

Group E - Exhibition Race Cars.

This is an exhibition group reserved for race cars and drivers with racing certifications. This group is by invitation or application with acceptance only. This group will operate under more stringent rules aligned with established racing event rules – even though this group will not be racing!


