Tech Talk/News:

(1) One handy feature not available on C6 (and C5) Corvettes was an auxiliary input for an IPod or phone.



You can easily add an auxiliary input to a C6 by purchasing approximately 20 feet of stereo headphone cable with 1/8" jack connections and tying into your XM module. This modification can be accomplished for as little as \$15.00. A

While there are methods to tie into the radio on a C5 it is more complex. As an alternative on a C5 or a C6 an aftermarket harness and adaptor can be purchased for between \$65.00 and \$80.00. iSimple is one manufacturer and you can find kits at several online sites including Amazon and eBay. An advantage to these kits is you don't have to break into your factory wiring harnesses.

garage door opener and need to add a repeater to your garage door opener to get the signal from your car to work be aware there are two different systems; Homelink in earlier cars and Lear Car2U in later cars. The repeater required will depend on the system you have. The Homelink system has three buttons with the Homelink logo above the center button while the Lear Car2U system has three buttons with an LED above each button.



GM Fairfax Assembly Plant Tour


April 12, 2017 09:00-11:15

Attached to this message are detailed instructions regarding safety and security regulations. NOTE: This is a walking tour that covers approximately 1 mile in length and there are no accommodations for those who cannot walk unassisted and/or keep up with the pace.

GM Fairfax Assembly Plant Tours – Guidelines

Safety

- All attendees must watch a ten minute safety video prior to the tour
- Be aware of emergency signals and evacuation routes
- In a medical emergency, call 7911 on a plant phone and briefly describe the medical emergency and the column number
- If separated from your host, call security at 7234 on a plant phone
- Walk in pedestrian pathways

What not to bring

- No cell phones
- No headphones
- No knives, sharp objects, guns or other items that could be considered weapons
- No backpacks or large bags
- Photos and video are not allowed unless special authorization is received and on record with the communications office at Fairfax.

What to wear

- Closed-toed, closed-heeled shoe; tennis shoe are appropriate (no mules, sandals, or high heels)
- Long pants (no skirts or shorts)
- Short or long sleeved shirt, blouse or T-Shirt (no Tank-Tops)

Your tour guide will provide appropriate protective gear including safety glasses with side shields, special gloves and Kevlar sleeves. These items must be worn at all times when instructed by the tour guide.

During the tour

- Wear mutilation protection gear for watches, bracelets, rings, etc. (This will be given to you by your guide.)
- At no time should you allow yourself to be separated from your host
- No smoking
- ONLY walk in pedestrian-marked pathways
- Make eye contact with fork truck and mobile equipment operators
- Stay out of posted restricted areas and any area that the tour guide mentions
- Watch for any floor hazards- spills, cords, etc.

Tours can and will be ended any time the rules are not followed.

Parking

Park in either of the two visitor lots adjacent to the flagpoles. Walk in the lobby across from the parking lot. Visitor lobby hours are 5:00am – 5:00pm)

If you have a foreign nameplate vehicle, you will be required to park in the far end of the NORTH or SOUTH lots. Foreign car parking areas are designated. Failure to park in a foreign car parking area may result in a ticket or towing.

I-65 Route - Kansas

Highway signs on I-70 and I-35 will direct you to I-635. Exit I-635 at Exit 8, the exit for Kansas Highway 5 and 18th Street. Follow Highway 5 to the first stoplight and turn right onto Sunshine Road. Travel Sunshine Road for approximately ½ mile to the main entrance of the plant.

I-70 Route – Missouri

Visitors traveling into the Kansas City area from the east on I-70 may find it easier to exit I-70 at 24 West Exit. This will take you around the downtown Kansas City, Missouri loop. Cross over the Lewis and Clark Viaduct to Kansas City, Kansas. Exit off viaduct at Exit 423D – Fairfax District and travel north on Fairfax Trafficway. Turn right into the main entrance of the plant at the intersection of Fairfax Trafficway and Sunshine Road.

*See Note Below – Direction from the North - Airport

Take I-29 to I-635 south exit (Exit 3) 2 miles to US-69 and US 169 south (exit left) over the Fairfax Bridge to the second stoplight (Sunshine Road) and turn left. Follow Sunshine Road for 3 blocks to the plant main entrance.

Directions from Kansas City International Airport

- Take I-29 South/US-71 South ramp towards Kansas City. Merge onto I-29S/US-71 South
- Take I-635 South/Exit 3B, towards Kansas. Merge onto I-635 South. I-635 South becomes I-635 South/US-69S. (Take the US-69 South Exit number 10, on the left. Merge onto US-69 South. US-69 South becomes US-69 North/North 7th Street Trafficway.
- Cross the Fairfax Bridge
- Turn left (east) on Sunshine Road
- Proceed East on Sunshine Road, which formally ends at Fairfax Trafficway continue straight east into the plant parking lots.
- Turn left where the driveway ends at the front of the plant. Park in either of the two visitor lots adjacent to flagpoles.


