





CLEANING THE EXTERIOR

Presented by: CHUCK LEVENSON

WASHING YOUR CORVETTE

- Demonstrate use of Adams new foam gun
- Tools to dry your Corvette after washing (plastic wipe, special drying towel or blower)

USE OF A CLAY BAR

- Use your hand inside a zip lock bag and run over the paint to see if you have rough spots.
- You can use a clay bar by hand and fold over if the surface gets full.

Hand held clay bar applicators

Clay bar material from Surf City that uses a solvent for lubrication that leaves a protective coat of wax

WAXING OPTIONS

- Hand waxing
- Carnauba wax
- Synthetic
- Electric Buffer





Detailing Tips - EXTERIOR Handout 2 of 5

CLEANING THE WHEELS & WHEEL WELLS

PRE SHOW CLEANING

- a. Before washing the car, spray the inside of the wheels with a degreaser & rinse.
- b. Wash the outside of the wheels with the appropriate wheel cleaner (chrome, clear coated painted, aluminum or alloy) OR use a generic wheel cleaner
- c. Clean the wheel wells using water and a rag or sponge. Dirty wheels may require a car wash.
- d. Dry the wheels using a soft towel or rag.

CLEANING THE ENGINE

The engine area is one of the two areas where most folks lose points at shows.

PRE SHOW CLEANING

- a. Using compressed air to blow out as much dust as possible.
- b. Using metal polish, polish the aluminum suspension "A" arms.
- c. Using the swifter reserved for the engine area, clean in all tight & open areas.
- c. Apply the Clyx exhaust manifold dressing or similar products to both exhaust manifolds with a Tooth brush or small art brush.
- d. Apply Super VRT or rubber dressing to hoses & air intake.
- e. Using a toothbrush, water and detail spray, clean around small items in the engine bay.
- f. Using In & Out Spray, spray the hard to reach areas in the engine bay.

AT THE SHOW (you will only have 2-3 hours to get your Corvette ready, so plan ahead)

- a. Look over the engine area to find any dust. Clean large areas with a swifter and smaller areas with a rag or toothbrush and your rubber cleaner or detailer for non rubber areas.
- b. Wipe off aluminum suspension arms with a soft cloth or use metal polish.
- c. Treat the wheel wells with Undercarriage spray.
- d. Wipe off wheels with a damp cloth or, if they are chrome, with a chrome cleaner.
- e. Apply tire shine to the tires.

BEST DISPLAY/ PRESENTATION

The judging requirements for this area are not well established and tend to be more subjective.

- a. In prior years this area was all about displaying information on the Corvette such as Build sheets, sales manuals and other items relating to the original purchase of the Corvette.
- b. This evolved to include 4' by 6' signs about the features on the Corvette placed in front of it
- c. Presentations have expanded to include special designs attached to the underside of the hood, lots of Chrome under the hood and model cars on the top of the engine.

SPECIAL PRODUCTS TO USE & PARTICIPANT QUESTIONS

- a. Detailing tips
 - Label plastic bags to hold your micro fiber towels for each type use.
 - Use the special makeup Q-tips with the point on one end and a flat end on the other end to clean in hard to detail areas such as emblems.
- b. Question: How to clean rubber products that have turned yellow or orange. Answer: Use about four treatments of Adams Tire & Rubber Cleaner.





Detailing Tips - INTERIOR Handout 3 of 5

VACUUMING

Vacuum the door panels, seats, dash, and trunk. Don't vacuum the floors until you are completely finished detailing the interior. You'll get it dirty and will need to vacuum a second time.

<u>Helpful tip:</u> Check edges of crevice tool for plastic flash. File down to prevent scratching leather surfaces or tearing cloth surfaces.

If the dust is very light, use a Swiffer to wipe off the dust. It will stick to the Swiffer and not spread around in the car.

DOOR JAMS

Use foam glass cleaning brush with either car wash soap or if really dirty, use Super Clean Aerosol or any All Purpose Cleaner such as Super Clean or Purple Power liquids. Mop up with microfiber towel.

Clean the rubber door seals and rubber window seals with some diluted APC. Mop up with Sam's Club microfiber towel. Start with 10:1 dilution and reduce dilution if dirt remains. Always better to be the least aggressive as possible.

Use Stoner Trim Shine inside door jam on rubber components and on the door and window seals—apply with microfiber pads or Scott Shop towels because they don't dust up or leave pieces of towel on the surfaces.

If more shine is desired use Mother's Protectant spray. I apply with Scott Shop towels or a microfiber pad. Knock down excess with microfiber towel.

Apply spray wax such as Meguiar's Ultimate Quik Wax inside door jams and around door edges.

I purchase my microfiber pads at Dollar Tree 3 for \$1. You can save them for reuse by putting in a Zip Lock storage bag and labeling.

<u>Helpful tip:</u> Use metal clips covered with plastic to hold doors open if working on a hilly surface.

DOOR SILLS

Clean with a diluted APC and mop up with microfiber towel. Apply Stoner Trim Shine, Mother's Protectant or some spray wax. It all depends on the amount of shine you want.

CLEANING VINYL & PLASTIC

Super Clean Degreaser 10 parts distilled water: 1 part Super Clean or 5:1 for carpets, mats, plastics and dirty leather. Scrub with microfiber cloth, or a toothbrush, or Mother's brush. If really dirty you may need to use Mr. Clean Magic Eraser or Oxo brush as it has tapered bristles that won't scratch...

Again, use least aggressive dilution as you can yet be sure to get everything clean prior to applying protectant.

Mop up with Sam's microfiber towels

DRESSING INTERIOR TRIM (OTHER THAN LEATHER SEATS)

After cleaning there are many products to choose from, depending on the amount of shine you desire.

Stoner Trim Shine liquid for satin matte look.

Mother's Protectant or Chemical Guys VRP for glossier look.

Meguiar's Quik Wax or Ultimate Quik Wax for a semi glossy smooth look.

Apply with microfiber pads. Knock down any excess with microfiber towel.

COATED LEATHER SEAT CLEANING & CONDITIONING

Spray generic Woolite diluted 5:1 on seats. Gently scrub seats with Colourlock leather brush if they are in good shape. Can also use Lexol Cleaner but it costs a lot more. Can also use Super Clean or Purple Power APC diluted 10:1.

Interior Detailing Tips Handout 4 of 5

COATED LEATHER SEAT CLEANING & CONDITIONING (cont.)

If seats are dirty or have dve transfer from you're clothing, use Super Clean diluted 5:1 and it will remove things like blue jean transfer.

Use toothbrush and Mother's brush for tight areas and crevices in seats.

Mop up with Sam's microfiber towels.

Most leather today is coated with a thin layer of plastic so applying "conditioners" is not going to penetrate into the leather. You can use products such as Lexol Conditioner but it really isn't nourishing the leather. Consider using Meguiar's Ultimate Fast Finish. Apply to a microfiber towel, then knock down any high spots.

CLOTH SEAT CLEANING

Most Vettes are vinyl or leather, but for your metal car or truck, use Super Clean diluted 5:1 and an Oxo Good Grips Heavy Duty Scrub brush. Wet down until damp, scrub with brush, and mop up with microfiber towel. Repeat as needed. Don't get the seats soaking wet as this will get into the foam and could cause mold. You can always reduce the dilution ratio if needed, but try to use the least aggressive dilution ratio.

PET HAIR REMOVAL

After vacuuming the interior thoroughly, pet hair can remain. Use the FURemover brush to pick up the excess hair and pull it into an area where you can use the vacuum to remove it all.

DASHBOARD & VENT CLEANING

Use a foam paint pad to clean the vent louvers. Spray water or some protectant like Stoner Trim Shine or Mother's Protectant on the pad and get in between the louvers. You can also use a dedicated soft bristle detailing brush or a makeup brush to get into the vents. Q-Tips are good for getting into tight places and for cleaning around emblems on the exterior.

If you have any clear coated plastics, be very careful as they scratch easily. Dust off with a makeup brush. Use one brush wet and the other dry. Dust off with the dry brush. Apply some detail spray or Stoner Trim Shine to the wet brush and scrub the plastic. Dry with microfiber towel.

WINDOW CLEANING

This is one of the hardest things to do and is a multi-step process.

- 1. Spray window with a mixture of isopropyl alcohol (IPA) mixed with distilled water diluted 1:1.
- 2. If that greasy residue from plastic outgassing remains on windows, spray IPA mix or APC onto a Mr. Clean Magic Eraser. Wipe it down and clean up with a microfiber towel. Some people will use ammonia based window cleaner if they have heavy residue, but you can't use this if you have aftermarket tint film applied. I don't use ammonia based window cleaner on anything.
- 3. Apply Mother's ReVision Glass and Surface cleaner or Stoner Invisible Glass Window Cleaner. Do not use Windex or any ammonia based product as it streaks. Get into the corners with the Stoner Invisible Glass Reach and Clean Tool. Use a dedicated microfiber window towel to dry.
- 4. For the ultimate shine and help in getting off some remaining streaks, apply Meguiar's Ultimate Quik Wax or any spray wax. This also helps rain run off of the windshield.

Helpful tip: When drying your windows, dry the inside either vertically or horizontally, and dry the outside window in the opposite direction. You will know which side of the window has streaks!

TRUNK

Wipe down plastic and SMC body panels with diluted APC. Mop up with microfiber towel.

Use spray wax on painted surfaces.

Treat plastic with Stoner Trim Shine for low gloss, Mother's Protectant for high gloss finish or Meguiar's Ultimate Quik Wax.

Vacuum.

CARPET AND CARPETED FLOOR MAT CLEANING

Vacuum as last step in finishing the interior and glass.

Use Super Clean diluted 5:1 and the Oxo Scrub brush. Mop up with a microfiber towel. As a last step, push all the fibers in the same direction using your microfiber towel.

CLEANING MICROFIBER TOWELS

Do not wash with any other towels or clothing.

Separate towels to avoid cross contamination. Purchase general purpose microfiber towels at

Sam's Club in various colors to denote usage and keep separate.

Use a perfume free, softener free liquid detergent such as Tide Free and Clear or Tide Pur.

Wash in warm water. Some recommend hot, but I don't do that.



Fill washer to the top with water and use a heavy dirt cycle with multiple rinses.

Dry on tumble cycle or let air dry.

When towels start getting really dirty, throw them away. Towels are cheap and Vette interiors and exterior paint are not.








Chase, the manager of Culver's is happy to sponsor CCKC again for our monthly Culver's Cruise. Terry and Bob Henn will host the event again this year.
