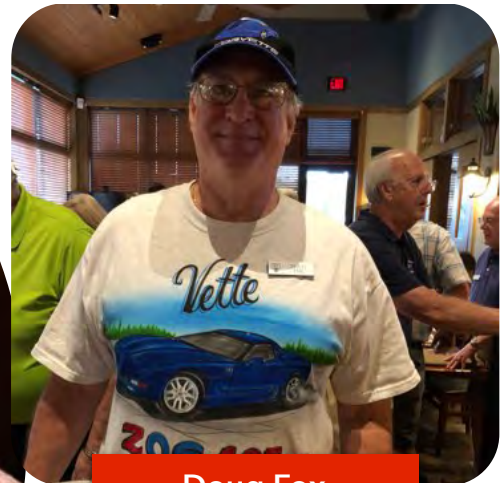

1. Place window card on dash.
2. Judging will be from 11:00 to 1:00.
3. Judges will open doors but not hoods. No points given for engine compartments hood is down.
4. Please do not ask judges questions during or after judging.
5. Judging sheets are the property of the judging committee and will not be given to participants.
6. Decisions of the judges are final.
7. Judges will select 1st place for each class.
8. There will be no ties.
9. Stock: No major changes from factory other than wheels, air intake or exhaust. Modified: Chrome, interior/exterior changes, modified engines, etc.
10. On day of show, new entries accepted by 10:00 AM will be judged. No cars entering

JUDGING CRITERIA

PAINT: Quality, Cleanliness, Luster
ENGINE COMPARTMENT: Neatness, Cleanliness, Workmanship. Includes engine block, inner fenders, firewall, radiator, hoses, exhaust manifolds, wiring, chrome, underside of hood, and no visible leaks.
EXTERIOR: Cleanliness, Body Panel Fit, Chrome (C1, C2, C3), Glass, Wheels and Tires. Includes tops, door handles, bumpers, outside mirrors, tailpipes and wheel wells.
INTERIOR: Cleanliness, Fit and Finish, Weatherstripping/Rubber. Includes dash, console, steering column, luggage area, upholstery, visors, door panels, door jams, carpet, glass and seat belts.
