SAGA OF A 1959 CORVETTE – by Charlie Dryer

[Most of you are probably not aware that CCKC member, Charlie Dryer and his son, operate a Corvette restoration shop in Blue Springs. So, we prevailed upon Charlie to write an article about one of his restorations. The "Clown Car" a true story in Charlie's own words.]



My name is Charlie Dryer, I joined the CCKC family in the fall of 2019 as I recall. Steve Garrett introduced me to the club through common membership in another Corvette Club, the local NCRS Chapter. For those who don't know, the National Corvette Restoration Society is aimed at a collective sharing of knowledge for the restoration of the Corvette. The goal is to return the cars to as "near as correct" condition as the day the vehicle was born. Anyway, my good friend Dave Evans, also known in Corvette circles as "Fuelie Dave" was in

contact with another old Corvette junkie in Omaha, Nebraska who had gotten wind of a 1959 Corvette two top car that was available for sale.

It turns out this was a one owner car! Needless to say, that alone was enough to tweak my interest and once my son Aaron and I had a chance to look at it, well we bought the thing. Now here is, as the late Paul Harvey would say, the rest of the story. The first owner purchased it new in July of 1959, drove it for 40 years, ran into a ditch at least once and somehow managed to poke a hole in the driver's side rear wheel well. We know this to be true because of one, the hole and two, about 20 pounds of road gravel under the spare tire.



At the time of purchase the original owner was in an assisted living facility with no family immediate or otherwise. However, he had befriended a lady that we worked with at the Western Electric Plant in Omaha. If you remember rotary and push button phones, Western

SUGGESTIONS FOR DETAILING YOUR CORVETTE WHILE QUARANTINED

We have suggested products that we use and know will work; however, most of you will already have something in your detailing bag that you can use.

- 1. Treat your dash with a vinyl product with UV protection (MEGUIARS ULTIMATE INTERIOR DETAILER) is one option. Be sure to do this before cleaning the inside of your front glass.
- 2. Treat all the rubber molding on your car. This maybe a good time to remove the top so you can treat the rubber on the front and back of the roof. If it has been a long time since it has been removed, we suggest you treat the exposed portion of the molding before removal and; be careful when removing the top so you don't tear the rubber!

ADAMS VRT OR MEGUIARS #40 VINYL & RUBBER CLEANER/CONDITIONER) can be an option to use. If the rubber is really in poor shape, consider using (DYNATEX SILICONE COMPOUND) for restoration. This product does not do miracles if the rubber is severally cracked or torn as replacement maybe your only option. Also, if the rubber has yellowed, especially in the engine area one option would be (ADAMS TIRE & RUBBER CLEANER)

3. Clean in inside of your glass, especially if you have already treated the dash. The outgassing of the

plastic products leaves a film on the inside of the glass that usually requires multiple cleaning, so cleaning the inside now can save you future time. Possible products include (A/C DELCO GLASS CLEANER available from our sponsor Hendrick Chevrolet). For extreme problems you may have to us a cleaner with ammonia; HOWEVER, BE VERY CAUTIOUS WITH USING THIS PRODUCT, SO YOU DON'T GET THE AMMONIA ON YOUR DASH. Use of a microfiber applicator tool (they come pointed or just rectangular) or just a good microfiber towel is a great option to apply your window cleaner onto the towel and keep it off the dash.

- 4. Treating your leather seats is a great project.
- Leather tends to dry out, so replenishing the moisture is recommended. One product option is (LEXOL LEATHER CONDITIONER). Rather than treating the seats and wiping off the conditioner, We like to let the seats set for a period of time before use, to let the conditioner really soak in.
- 5. Another detailing option is to clay bar your paint. If you are not sure the paint needs clay baring, borrow a small zip lock bag from your spouse's cabinet, put your hand in the bag and rub it over the paint. If you feel rough spots, this indicates the need to clay bar to get rid of these impurities on top of the paint. You will need to wax the areas you clay bar after treatment, because

the clay bar treatment removes all or most of the wax.


- 6. If you didn't remove any bugs or road tar from the paint before storing your corvette for the winter, this would be a great time to do this. Most any of the products available will work for this project.
- 7. One last recommendation would be to start your corvette and let it warm up.

We realize that you can't go into the local auto parts stores if you need products, but Amazon or Google is always an option. Also, most auto parts stores have programs where you can call ahead, and they will bring the product out to you at the curb.
