On December 27, 2020, we lost one of our avid Corvette members, Mr. Tom Kearns. Tom's departure came 2 days after his 76th birthdays. His departure will be felt by many. Most of us

will remember Tom for his knowledge of the Corvette and many stories some to be told in public and some, well among close friends. Tom will be missed. Tom became a member of the Corvette Club of Kansas City January 1, 1997. As a member, Tom was highly active in our club holding several officer positions and leading and directing many events. Tom's love for the Corvette drove him to hold membership in various other Corvette organizations like The National Corvette Restorers Society and a Touch of Glass Car Club.

Tom was a military veteran by way of the U.S. Army as military police during Vietnam from 1966-1968. Following his military service, Tom married the light of his life Barbara Ann Browne on May 3, 1969. To this union, 2 children were born, Kevin and Kelly. Tom was grandpa to 4 grandchildren.

Tom was educated at Truman State University earning a BS degree in Administration of Criminal Justice graduating Cum Laude.

Following his military career, he joined the St. Louis County Police Department from 1968 -1979. Following his stay with the police department, Tom worked for Digital Telecommunication Systems for Tyco Corporation from 1979 - 2003 obtaining the position of District Sales Manager.

Tom had made a final request from the Corvette Club of Kansas City and that was a Corvette Caravan to his final resting place at Leavenworth National Cemetery. Our Club honored that request on January 7, 2021.

Butch gave a brief history on the museum. The museum, located on the corner of 116th and Strang Line Rd in Olathe, has been open since 2015. The museum can handle up to 35 cars with 21 cars on permanent display. **March has been designated Corvette Month.** There is also a drive-in area where the 5 club members' Corvettes will be displayed during the month of March. Any member interested in displaying their car needs to contact Steve by the end of January. The dates for

moving the Corvettes in is February 27th and move out date is March 27th.

Tim McCarthy is a board member of the Kansas City Automotive Museum, and presented information about their new, a subterranean facility that provides a safe place to store your vehicle, located on the north side of 31st street, between Broadway Boulevard and Southwest Trafficway. This facility is part of the Kansas City Automotive Museum portfolio. There is also a roof top area that can hold over 220 vehicles for club events, ride and drive events, or outdoor events.
